SOUTHINGTON, July 9 -- Down by four runs, Edgewood's Steve Julius hit a HR to spark Edgewood-Bristol to a 15-5 win over Somers and a sweep of the best-of-3 championship series. "We just weren't playing with any confidence early. But that home run really gave us the lift we needed," Edgewood manager Matt Arburr told the *Bristol Press*. "Hitting is definitely contagious and that really got us going. It gave us some confidence." Edgewood sent 15 hitters to the plate in the fourth inning and scored nine runs to seize command of the game. Andrew Martin and Justin Jakubiak each had a 2-RBI double in the fourth.
